Medway Youth Soccer board members have been receiving a steady flow of inquiries from parents regarding indoor soccer. As an organization, Medway Youth Soccer does not participate in any indoor leagues. We neither encourage nor discourage playing indoor soccer. If your child desires to play, and you are unable to get him or her on a team, here is some information on your options (straight from the facilities):

#### **JOHN SMITH SOCCER CENTER**

John Smith operates a complete soccer center in Milford, Mass. The center has a trained staff ready to help you, a pro shop, and plenty of room for play.

All age groups from Under-8 through Adults play on two big arenas with Field Turf, which is inlaid with a sand and granulated rubber mixture. Cleats are the recommended shoe choice.

Games are 50 minutes in length, consisting of two 25-minute halves and no halftime break.

There are two sessions remaining:

Session 2: December 28, 2006 - February 17, 2006

Session 3: February 22, 2007 - April 15, 2007



### **THE FRANKLIN SOCCER SCHOOL**

The Franklin Soccer School, founded by two avid soccer people, Kevin Sayward and Rich Frongillo, provides an opportunity for individuals to improve their soccer abilities.

Students who train with FSS are encouraged to focus on fundamental techniques to construct a solid foundation for enjoying the beautiful game of soccer. Every individual will succeed with careful attention to detail and an interest in improvement.

The Franklin Soccer School offers Mini Soccer, a 3v3 indoor program at Carpe Diem Field, a new turf facility in town. It includes:

- Focus on player development.
- Standings and playoffs for each six-session season. Each session is 90 minutes with the first 30 focusing on skills, followed by 60 minutes of round robin play.
- Low cost at \$75 per player per season.
- Individual sign-ups. Teams will be formed on the first day to create a fun, competitive environment.

Fore Kicks is a fully insulated building that boasts the three largest indoor fields in New England inside an 85,000 square foot, clear span steel building. The facility is currently the only MYSA sanctioned indoor facility in Massachusetts so MYSA insurance coverage is applicable. Here's more:

- Full concessions, wireless internet, weight room and fitness center available for parents and players, a Pro Shop for your last minute soccer equipment needs, ample parking, overhead video cameras for taping games for coaches, and more.
- A staff comprised of professionally trained coaches, and all are certified in CPR, First Aid and AED. Automatic Electronic Defibrillator is on the premises.
- Indoor Soccer leagues that run from kindergarten-aged through U-18.
- No player membership fees required for any programs.
- Most sessions run 10-12 weeks with the next session starting at the end of January.

### **THINGS TO REMEMBER:**

- Parents are encouraged to go online and fill out coaching evaluations. Your input is important to us. The feedback we receive will help us identify the strengths and weaknesses of our coaches as well as the entire program. The form is located on the home page ([www.medwaysoccer.com](http://www.medwaysoccer.com)) and must be printed out and mailed to MYS, PO Box 11, Medway, MA 02053.
- Medway Youth Soccer will host a Grade 9 referee course Monday, Jan. 22 and Wednesday, Jan. 24 from 5:30-9:30 pm. You may register online for this course at [www.massref.net](http://www.massref.net). Click on "Course List" (beneath "Become a Referee") on the

left side of the page. This will bring you to a page that lists all of the Grade 8 and Grade 9 courses that the MSRC (Mass State Referee Committee) is offering this winter. You need to create an account, and then you can register for the Medway (or any other) course. Note: Grade 9 referees can ref 6v6 games and possibly 8v8 games. In order to referee 11v11 games you must complete your Grade 8 referee training. The courses listed are open to all and first come first serve. Contact [Tim Adams](#) if you have any questions.
